SCHEDULE

1. All domestic effluents arising in the premises shall be discharged via a treatment plant provided for this purpose.
2. The volume of effluent discharged excluding storm water shall not exceed 18 m<sup>3</sup>/day.
3. The effluent shall comply with the following standards:-

pH Range	6.0 - 9.0
R.O.D. (5 day)	20 mg/l.
Suspended Solids	30 mg/l.
4. All storm water shall be passed through a 3 chambered interceptor system provided for the removal of petroleum hydrocarbons. The petroleum hydrocarbon content of the storm water as discharged shall not exceed 50 mg/l but in any case the storm water discharge shall not give rise to any petroleum hydrocarbons being visible downstream of the point of discharge. The interceptor shall be inspected on a weekly basis to ensure that it continues to function satisfactorily. The Licensee shall keep a record of all inspections which shall be available for inspection by Personnel from the Licensing Authority.
5. The Licensee shall provide suitable locations for the sampling of both the effluent and storm water lines after these streams have been treated. This sampling location shall be available at all reasonable times to Personnel from the Licensing Authority for the purpose of taking samples.
6. The Licensee shall provide a flow meter either on the inlet line or the outlet line for the purpose of determining the volume of effluent discharged. This flow meter shall be available for inspection by Personnel from the Licensing Authority at all reasonable times.
7. All sludges and wastes arising from the effluent treatment plant and from the petroleum hydrocarbon interceptor shall be disposed of in a manner and at a location to be agreed with the Licensing Authority.
8. The Licensee shall pay to the Licensing Authority annual contributions towards the cost of monitoring the discharge as it considers necessary for the performance of its functions under this Act. Not later than 1st October 1987, the licensee shall pay to Cork County Council a contribution of £100 and in subsequent years shall pay an annual amount of £100 updated in accordance with the Consumer Price Index from the date of grant of the licence, to the value pertaining at the time of payment of each such annual contribution.
